Wilson College has been awarded a \$25,000 grant from the West Penn Power Sustainable Energy Fund to pay for an energy-saving LED lighting system in the college's renovated John Stewart Memorial Library and new learning commons. LED lights will comprise approximately 42 percent of the library's \$85,000 lighting system. Projections show that the combined lighting system will use 37 to 40 percent less electrical power than the previous lighting scheme. Read Story.

The Republic Food Enterprise Center has received a \$25,000 grant to assist with the construction of the Center's cool room expansion, which will utilize hybrid cooling technology. The cool room will be used for the storage and processing of vegetables at the Food Hub located in Republic, PA. The RFEC is a non-profit community organization that serves as a comprehensive Center for the development of sustainable food products and social enterprise

for western Pennsylvania which benefits small farms, food deserts, and the working population throughout the region. Read Story.

Shop Demo Depot announced that the West Penn Power Sustainable Energy Fund has approved a \$23,312 grant to assist with the installation of 25 new DayStar Natural Lighting Systems in its Mt. Pleasant location. Installation will begin in May 2015. The

WPPSEF grant will cover the costs of the product and installation for the retail store. With a commitment to being eco-friendly by diverting useful items to a landfill, Shop Demo Depot, a social enterprise of Westmoreland Community Action, has taken its mission another step by conserving electricity with the DayStar Natural Lighting Systems; a skylight that diffuses natural light for energy efficiency and conservation. Kudos

Building Performance Architecture and Rob Hosken, WPPSEF board member, did the PHIUS+ rating work for the largest PHIUS+ certified Passive House affordable multifamily project. Passive House Institute US (PHIUS) announced that Uptown Lofts on Fifth, developed by Pittsburgh's Action-Housing, has received PHIUS+ Certification validating that the 24-unit project meets a

rigorous performance standard that reduces energy consumption for heating and cooling by 60-80 percent compared to conventional design. It is the largest multi-family affordable housing property to be certified by the Passive Housing Institute-U.S., said Katrin Klingenberg, executive director of the institute.
